SUP PACKAGING

Single-use plastic packaging









<u>European Directive 2019/904</u>, on the reduction of the impact of certain plastic products on the environment, called the Single-Use Plastics (SUP) Directive, was approved as part of the European Strategy for Plastics in a Circular Economy. This directive is the instrument launched by the European Commission to shift towards a more circular plastics sector and to combat the pollution caused by certain plastic products.

This directive was incorporated into our legal system through <u>Law 7/2022 on</u> <u>Waste and Contaminated Soils for a Circular Economy</u>, which lays out measures and obligations to encourage the reduction, reuse and recycling of single-use plastic packaging, as well as to promote more sustainable alternatives.

What is a single-use plastic product?

Law 7/2022, Article 2 aa, defines single-use plastic products as: "a product made wholly or partly of plastic and which has not been conceived, designed or placed on the market to complete, within its lifetime, multiple circuits or rotations by being returned to a producer to be refilled or reused for the same purpose for which it was conceived"

What are the economic implications?

With regard to the economic implications of this SUP packaging placed on the market, **Article 60 of Law 7/2022 states that the following costs apply to this packaging:**



- a The costs of **awareness-raising** measures.
- The costs of waste **collection** for those products that are discarded via public collection systems, including **infrastructure** and its **operation**, and the subsequent transport and **treatment** of that waste.



The costs of **cleaning up litter** resulting from those products, and its subsequent transport and processing.



These costs are reflected in the prices that are identified as SUP. These rates reflect, in addition to the cost of each material, the estimated cost applicable to this packaging. This rate is provisional and will be updated as new details become available through the assessments that made of the SUP packaging waste appearing in collections. Which SUP packaging is affected by the expansion of Extended Producer Responsibility?

The Law sets out a series of measures and obligations related to SUP packaging. However,

in this guide we will focus only on those affected by the extension of the Extended Producer Responsibility, as reflected in Article 60 and specifically detailed in Annex IV, section F.

The following packaging is specified:






such as boxes, with or without a cover, used to contain food which:



- **b)** Is typically consumed from the container.
- c) Is ready to be consumed without any further preparation, such as cooking, boiling or heating; including food containers used for fast food or other meals ready for immediate consumption, except beverage containers, plates, packets and wrappers containing food.




PACKAGING AND WRAPPERS

made from flexible material containing food that is intended for immediate consumption from the packet or wrapper, without any further preparation.



BEVERAGE CONTAINERS WITH CAPACITIES OF UP TO THREE LITERS

that is, receptacles used to contain liquids, such as beverage bottles including their caps and lids; and composite beverage packaging, including its caps and lids; but not glass or metal beverage containers that have caps and lids made from plastic.

LIGHTWEIGHT PLASTIC BAGS as defined in RD 293/2018 of 18 May.

How is this SUP packaging identified on the Packaging Data Platform?







This legal basis has been used to define a series of criteria to identify the packaging that falls under this responsibility for single-use plastics. This section indicates which types of packaging and families would be affected.

It is very important to note that **SUP affects only the main element of the packaging, and caps and lids** (when made of plastic).





1. Product packaging

1.1. Packaging type

This section identifies the packaging categories of the **Waste Law** and their correspondence with the packaging types and product families on the **Packaging Data Platform**.

1.2. Product families: thresholds for defining single doses or individual use

a) Foods for immediate consumption

For these families, the only food product families considered are those below the maximum volume determined as a single dose or individual portion for immediate consumption, which we indicate below:



Exceptions

The following exceptions to the classification of packaging affected by SUP are established:

Recital 12 of the Directive states that containers containing portions of food larger than individual portions, or containers with individual portions of food sold in several-unit format are not to be considered single-use plastic products for the purposes of that Directive. Therefore, the packaging of food products mentioned in the previous table may be declared "NON-SUP" if they are marketed in packs of several units. On the platform they are identified by default as "SUP" since it is not possible to distinguish whether the product is marketed individually or in a grouped manner. For cases of sale in packs, you can uncheck the 'SUP' check on the screen, or specify SUP = 'N' if the Excel upload template is used.

Illustrative examples:







• In the following food product families, SUP does not apply to all the product categories contained therein. The exemption in the application of the SUP requires an additional level of information on the declaration to indicate the following categories:


In the case of service packaging, since there is no information about the product it contains, it is assumed that the SUP applies to all of it (unless otherwise indicated on the platform). If the product contained in the packaging can be identified as not affected by the SUP, this field can be unchecked.





How will it appear on the Packaging Data Platform?

On the platform, the packaging elements that match these criteria will be identified as SUP in a field specifically provided for this purpose.
